The school is delighted to announce that we were successful in a STEM Learning Grant. It was decided to invest in Six Bricks, a hands-on tool for learning. Through fun and short activities, the children practise memory, movement and use games designed to wake up the brain! Supporting the new maths curriculum, Six Bricks give children time to manipulate concrete tools (six colourful duplo bricks) which facilitate learning and development. As part of our SPHE and Wellbeing programme, the Junior & Senior Infants took part in some live Wellbeing Workshops during October & November. This is a 10 week programme which aims to build resilience, increase wellbeing and enhance the emotional literacy in children.

Ms. Darby's Senior Infants and Ms. Hough's Second Class have also been chosen to partake in the project. This year, Holy Family JNS is working toward our fifth green flag. Over the years we have earned the flags for Litter & Waste, Energy, Water and Travel. The fifth flag focuses on Biodiversity. This theme looks at the steps which can be taken in primary schools to increase the children's awareness of the importance of native plants, animals and habitats and the necessity of increasing species-richness in a locality.
