Literacy	<p>Reading:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Wonderland readers are available at http://wonderland.cjfallon.ie• Click on Stage 2 and scroll across to 'A Surprise for Feena'.• Continue reading from where your child's class left off, reading 2-3 pages per day. <p>Novel Work</p> <p>Children have already picked a novel of their own choosing to read over the next few weeks.</p> <p>This week's tasks:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Write the thoughts in the head of a character: choose a character from the novel and write <u>part of the story</u> from his/her point of view. You will use the word 'I' in the story. For example: "Hi! I am Ms Trunchbull and let me tell you my story."• Draw a picture of the front cover of your book but based on the Character that you have chosen side of the story. For example: Ms Trunchbull might rename the book 'Matilda' to 'That Troublesome, Naughty Child!' <p>Creative Writing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Continue on with the title given to you last week.• Write a story based on the idea 'The Easter Bunny Who Lost His/Her Eggs'. <p>Also this week as we are coming up to Easter we would like you to write an acrostic poem based on the word Easter. For example 'E is for Eggs'</p> <p>Sound of the Week</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• 'sion' making the /shun/ sound, e.g. revision, invasion, television etc. <ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ Come up with a list of words that contain this sound.➤ Practise putting these words into sentences.➤ Dictation based on this week's sound. <p>Grammar</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• This week's grammar topic focuses on 'prepositions'.• Preposition is a word that describes where a noun is in relation to another noun. For example 'Inky left her mouse-hole and went <u>under</u> the fence'• There are plenty of helpful videos on www.youtube.com• Scratch Garden have a fun song to explain the topic https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=xyMrLQ4ZI-4• There are some fun games based on 'prepositions' Write all of the items in your bedroom that are 'under' For example, 'My book is under my teddy'
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	<p>Comprehension</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • ‘My Read at Home 2’ book available at https://my.cifallon.ie/login • Click on ‘Student Resources’ and filter across. <p>This week’s comprehension: ‘Easter Island’ pg. 92</p> <p>Remind children to read the questions before they read the comprehension so that they have an idea of what to look out for when reading.</p>
<p>Maths</p>	<p>Each week, the children will focus on a different mathematical topic or concept. This week’s topic is: weight</p> <p>Don’t forget to sign into www.folensonline.ie for access to Planet Maths book.</p> <p>Some additional activities based on weight:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 10 different objects from their house. They must first estimate then measure the weight of the objects before placing them in order from lightest to heaviest. • The children can estimate then measure how many pencils, crayons, teddies etc. weigh the same as $\frac{1}{4}$ kg, $\frac{1}{2}$ kg and 1kg. • Packaging: Look at packaging. Make a list of the weights on packages and then group products with similar weights. • Find examples of different items that weigh less than 1kg, weigh 1kg and more than 1kg in the house. Try find ten items in each category • Write a recipe for Easter Chocolate Corn Flake Cakes using grams.
