Literacy	<p>Reading:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">Continue to spend 10 minutes reading aloud and 10 minutes DEAR time. <p>Novel Work:</p> <p>Children should have already picked a new novel of their own choosing to read over the next few weeks.</p> <p>This week's tasks</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">You have three wishes!A genie lands in the midpoint of the story you have just read and grants the two main characters three wishes.What do they wish for and why?Finally, would their wishes have changed anything about the story? How so?Again, think about the cause and effect relationship and how this may have altered the path of the book you have been reading. <ul style="list-style-type: none">A LIFETIME TALE IN PICTURESDraw the main character from a book you have recently read. Show them as a baby, a child (How they appear in the book) and as an older person.Underneath each picture write what you think they might be doing at that point of their life and explain why they may be doing so.For example, if you drew Harry Potter as a baby, he might be casting spells on his mum to feed him lots of yummy food.This activity is very easy for all age groups to adapt their skill level and text style.
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Creative writing:

- My SPACE-tacular vacation.
- Write a letter to your friend telling him or her about your trip to outer space.
- Talk about how you travelled there – teleportation/ rocket/ spacecraft etc.
- Tell the reader the name of the planet you visited and describe it. Is it different to earth? How is it the same? Have you to wear a space suit when you go outside? What can you do for fun? Is it like a normal holiday?
- Don't forget to use adjectives and adverbs in your writing to help paint a picture of the planet the reader's head.
- You can visit an already discovered planet or you can make up your own.
- Use the word mats provided to help you when writing.
- Don't forget to proofread your writing.

Sound of the Week:

 - Practise putting these words into sentences.
 - Dictation based on this week's sound.

Grammar:

- This week's grammar topic will focus on "interesting words".
- We are looking for more interesting words to us when we write.
- Sometimes we use the same word too often, think of a more interesting word that we can use that means the same thing e.g. mad – angry – cross – annoyed

Maths	<p>Each week, the children will focus on a different mathematical topic or concept. This week's topic will continue to focus on: Money.</p> <p>Note: This is a very important topic and can be quite difficult for some children. If you are searching for other resources online, please ensure that the problems you source are age appropriate.</p> <p>Don't forget to sign into www.folensonline.ie for access to Planet Maths book.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Vocabulary to focus on this week: coins, euro, cent, price, spend, sell, buy, bought, sold, change, costs, less, more, equals, exchange, dear, cheap, cheaper, total cost, amount, value, worth, altogether, same value as, how much? • Complete and design a menu of a restaurant with accompanying price lists. The customer will get a €1 or €2 and order something from the menu. (each item must be below those prices) They must then check they have received the correct change. • Set up a shop in your house – fruit shop, toy shop, stationary shop etc. Price the objects in your shop. Pretend you are the customer pick three things and add up the price. Arts	<p>Space Art:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Children can design their own solar systems. They can be our own solar system with all the planets or a new one. • If you had black paper and chalk this would be great but if not crayons and normal paper will be perfect! • For the planets: Using a pencil draw various sized circles, about 5-6 circles onto the sheet of paper (only half the sheet). Color and blend colored chalk onto circles, blending right off the edges. Using white chalk, outline the edge of the circle to create a highlight. <p>Music:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Listen to the songs 'Sprach Zarathustra Op 30' by Strauss https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=dfe8tCcHnKY and Star Wars theme song https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=_D0ZQPqeJkk • How do these two songs make you feel? Happy/sad? Do they make you feel like sleeping or dancing? • Pick one of the pieces of music. What does this song remind you of? Draw a picture based on what story you think this piece of music is telling.
